Whole-school enrichment

Learning is enriched through the following methods:

- handling artefacts
- exploring scared texts
- using imaginative play or drama to express feelings and ideas
- responding to images, games, stories, art, music and dance
- meeting visitors from local religious communities
- making visits to religious places of worship where possible, and where not, making use of videos and the internet
- taking part in whole school events- (multi-faith days, Harvest Festival, school performances) participating in moments of quiet reflection
- participating in regular assemblies delivered by Faith leaders
- using ICT to further explore religion and belief globally
- comparing religions and worldviews through discussion
- debating and communicating religious belief, worldviews and philosophical ideas and answering and asking ultimate questions posed by these
- Half-termly Assemblies delivered by Faith in Scarborough Schools
- Bi-annual Interfaith trip to Bradford
- Bi-annual Class 1 trip to the Salvation Army and Muti-faith centre in Scarborough
- Regular assemblies delivered by local Vicar
- Interactive Workshops delivered by Faith in Scarborough Schools

Time for RE

Schools have a statutory responsibility to deliver Religious Education to all pupils, except those withdrawn by parents (see p.11). Schools must ensure that sufficient time is given in order to enable pupils to meet the expectations set out in this agreed syllabus, ensuring that the curriculum is coherent and shows progression, particularly across transitions between key stages. There is no single correct way of making appropriate provision for RE as long as the outcomes are met. In order to deliver the aims and expected standards of the syllabus effectively, the expectation is that there is a minimum allocation of 5 per cent of curriculum time for RE. This is set out in the table below, and based on the most recent national guidance:

4–5s	36 hours of RE, e.g. 50 minutes a week or some short sessions implemented through continuous provision			
5–7s	36 hours of tuition per year (e.g. an hour a week, or less than an hour a week plus a series of RE days)			
7-11 s	45 hours of tuition per year (e.g. an hour a week, or a series of RE days or weeks amounting to 45+ hours of RE)
