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The leaving memories of an emotional Brompton Family 'mum'!!

After 14 years of being embedded within the Brompton Family – I am now READY TO FLY!

Being a parent of two girls here at the school was a very special time. Not only did the girls gain a fantastic education, we as a family made lifelong friends and became part of something very special. Our earliest memories of 'adding value' to the **Family** are of Easter Crafty Days at Sawdon Village Hall preparing our eggs to roll down Castle Hill on Easter Sunday. This then led to Trick or Treating around Sawdon for Halloween – in order to help create a safe and special environment for the families to come together on a cold and spooky night. The last one we hosted had over 50 children joining, as friends and siblings wanted a piece of the action – Sawdon residents have never created so many treats since!! Next came the Christmas Caroling around Sawdon, where families came together and we sang our hearts out around the village – ending with mulled wine and mince pies around the Hargreaves kitchen table. All of these events were for all of our families and not just 'the girl's friends', as here at Brompton we have always been inclusive.

It was then time to support FRIENDS. Hannah Wallace and I ran many bake sales, craft fairs, sponsored walks (to name a few) with our best creation being the Leavers BBQ. For 10 years Darren manned the BBQ and I manned the kitchen. Many happy memories were made as children created havoc up trees, in farmers' fields, cycling up the lane, Mrs Stroud's Leavers cake and of course the ultimate activity of THE football match. Even after children left our school, this was the one event that they always came back to at the end of term. Mr Cooper and Darren were always determined to go back to being 10 years old again!

And then came the Governors years - and wow what a baptism of fire that one was! Two new Head Teachers, two Ofsted's, and a language that was totally new to me. Being a Governor was a privilege but also a huge responsibility. I highly recommend anyone who wants to give back to their community to apply for these vacancies, but ensure you go to all the training and become aware of what all the terminology used means. The great thing about being a Governor is that you can use your own skill base to add value and see outside of the education bubble to help drive positive change. It was here that we created Buddies, our before & after school club. Being a full-time working mum, and also seeing that numbers were declining – it was obvious that we needed to create added value to what we could offer. This is such a crucial part of our school life now and one I have massively enjoyed being a part of.

Finally, I got to come 'inside' and have spent the last 4 years as your School Administrator. I have absolutely LOVED this role and am very proud of the changes and support I have been able to make. Coming into a role that had not had anyone in place for almost a year was quite a daunting task – but the support that Mr Cooper gave me was fabulous. Together we muddled through that first year with the one thing at the forefront of our mind at all times 'FOR THE CHILDREN'. So, let's take a trip down memory lane and remember all the things that we have done together during my time in the seat:

- Completely revamped the School Office and Staff Room to allow for more space to gather, educate, discuss, relax, and be ill (amazing what a comfy cosy white chair can fix).
- Update of systems and processes to make them more electronic and reduce waste and paper (in line with our Nature & Respect value). I know many of you curse at ParentPay and the text messaging service but trust me it works so much better than the alternative.
- FOOD Celebrations and boy did we go to town on this (I'm definitely a feeder!!) Parent breakfasts and lunches, Coffee & cake mornings in the office for families, bacon butties and ice-cream trips to Glaves, Buddies Breakfasts, Toast etc. at break times for Mental Health Week, and of course Childrens Choice lunches wow we knew how to eat and have fun with everyone for any occasion. And then don't forget all the times I cooked for the school when we had no cook loved this!
- And then there were the events Royal celebrations with a royal bodyguard, soldier, mayor, garden party attendees; India Day; Skateboarding Day; Charity fundraisers; music in the playground the list is endless.









However, the things I am most proud of, and hope will have impacted the children in the best possible way to help them through life, are the wellbeing activities and giving the children a voice. Re-launching the School Council and setting up the Wellbeing Team were important ways to let the children drive change in the school that was important to them. Creating home care-packages for the children throughout Covid which included playing cards, fun activities, print outs to follow the scheme of work, delivering Christmas Day lunch to those children who couldn't be in school, and calling every family every week just to check in. Collaborating with our FRIENDS to help support the extra activities that the school cannot pay for and therefore improving our children's experiences. Achieving the Bronze Healthy Schools Award for the work that we do to support our Childrens Emotional Wellbeing. The Summer Term Walking Bus – such a special time to be had with those children as we started the day in the fresh air and nature, litter picking, flower discovering, farming discussions and insect lifesaving. All this finally culminating in the myHappymind scheme and workshops. The outcome of this for the future I hope will be my lasting legacy and help improve the lives of our wonderful children and families that will always connect them back to being


