We are already working on the recommendations from the report in order to make our curriculum even better – preparing the children even better,

enthusing them even more and linking our learning even more effectively – ultimately so the children learn more and remember more.

Thank you to the parents and children who came to the East Barnby meeting on Wednesday. It was great to be able to talk through some of the worries of the children and dispel one or two myths!!! Miss Thwaites and myself are really looking forward to seeing the children try new activities and the school Pillars shining through – hopefully in the May sunshine! Don't worry if you couldn't make it – I will keep the parent packs with me while doing the morning gate duty and will give you the information then.

Parent engagement and reading are both areas of school life which we are keen to continue to develop. Next week we are holding a 'Stay and Read' event which will hopefully help us to do both, and give parents another opportunity to come in to school. Look out for more details on dojos!

The school day is extraordinarily busy. In order to allow us to start our spelling and 'Read Write Inc' phonics sessions more promptly at the start of the morning, from **Monday the Class1 and Class 2 children will be able to go into their classes from 8:50am each morning, ahead of the usual start time of 9am**. There is no obligation to arrive early - the gate will close at the usual time.

Forest School has now been paused until after the Spring half term. This will allow the woodland that we use to recover and also allow for essential maintenance work. The teachers will still look for opportunities to adopt outdoor learning or learning outside the classroom where possible.


