**Hello everybody,**

On Tuesday, due to the positive feedback received from pupils and parents following the last session, we will be hosting our second **Read With Me** session. This is simply to allow family members the chance to read with the children, fostering a love of reading for pleasure. We will be opening school from 3:10pm. It will be great to see as many of you in school as possible!

On Tuesday 7<sup>th</sup> February we will be opening the classrooms for our first '**Stay And Learn session**', allowing family members to come into the classrooms and look at how we teach maths, as well as have a go at some of the activities with the children. **In a slight change to the advertised time, this will run from 9am until 9:30am.** Don't worry if you can't make this session – we have more planned through the year.

If any of you have managed to make a start on your spring cleaning and have any clothes, pairs shoes, handbags or belts that you would like to get rid of. Please keep them until the week of the 6 February.

We will confirm the exact date of when to bring the bags into school in due course.

Previously the children have been given bags for you to fill and return, they haven't this time as you the company now accepts any bag.

Rag-bag is a company that runs a recycling scheme whereby they collect unwanted, wearable clothing, paired shoes, handbags and belts, they then weigh them and pay for every kilogram collected.

The collected items are sorted and graded by the company and then they are exported to where they are needed.

There will be a limit of two families per week.

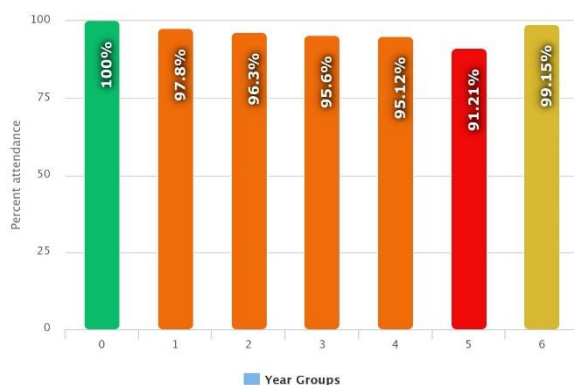
*This is a great opportunity for you to see what is happening in school that week, experience our super school lunches, and spend some time with the children and adults in school.*

### I'M A PARENT

All children and young people across North Yorkshire can get involved in a range of holiday activities, with free places and lunch for children receiving benefits-related Free School Meals.

If your child is eligible for benefits-related Free School Meals, they will receive a letter from their school with a unique code. This will enable you to book school holiday activities that are part of the FEAST programme for free. You can browse through the list of activities on our website.

If you think your child is eligible but they haven't received a code, please request a code using the form on our website.

### I'M A SCHOOL

Schools can also get involved in the FEAST programme in a number of ways - as an activity provider, a host venue or their kitchen facilities can be used to supply food to other providers.
