**Hello everybody,**

As we hurtle towards Easter, school is as busy as ever!

Next week the children will be completing their **Spring Assessments**, giving us an accurate measure of how much progress they have made this term. The results of these are subsequently used by teachers to plan interventions, support and address any gaps in learning which are apparent. The analysis of these assessments is key to establish if there are any trends in how the children are learning. This is a lengthy process, but so important if we are to ensure that all of the children achieve well. Teachers will adapt how they present information, tasks and questions in response to this, as well as adapt what is taught when. Teachers will be able to outline how the children have done in these assessments at the **Parent Consultation** meetings in the last week of term. Please book a slot by contacting Mrs Hargreaves.

It is also **Science Week** next week. The children will be learning about a range of Scientific approaches, Scientists and breakthroughs in assemblies this week. Exposing the children to new technologies and where these are being adopted is an ongoing focus for us, always balanced with our Pillars and the impact that these might have on Nature. It's vital that we take every opportunity to expose the children to issues and developments on a national and global scale, to develop their knowledge of issues, develop that sense of global responsibility and also (hopefully) inspire them to look into things deeper in the future. This half term, the children have already explored the wider implications of the increasing use of Robotics in workplaces, explored the development of Dyson (thank goodness he didn't give up when things were tough at the start!) and explored the implications and use of Artificial Intelligence!

**Assemblies are always a time for us to celebrate and explore our Pillars.** The children are fantastic at linking these to whatever we might be discussing, from helping families displaced from Ukraine, to providing the last remaining Siberian Crane with a mate, to the quest for 100% recycling. **Conservation and the care of the environment** always feature highly and it has been super to hear the children talk about how we and others can make a difference at a local, national and global level.

Apologies to those who were excited about coming to the **Garden Working Parties** this week! I have rearranged these for Wednesday 22<sup>nd</sup> and Thursday 23<sup>rd</sup> March from 3:30pm -6pm (or whatever time you can spare!). I hope that you will be able to come down and help us.

## Safeguarding

As a parent of two teenagers, I know just how hard it is to try to keep them safe on the internet at home or even monitor what they are doing. This week, our weekly safeguarding update from Andrew Hall contained an article which covered many of these challenges:

### **Online Protection Checklist for the Home - Internet Watch Foundation**

It is of vital importance to protect children from the online sphere whilst in schools. The reality though, is that the majority of dangers posed from this portal to the world's less conducive elements comes from inside the home. Out of the range of school filtering software, mandated software bans and other measures that can be taken in educational establishments. The Internet Watch Foundation, an superb organization from which we regularly cite in these briefings, has released a checklist to help mitigate the risks at home from the internet. This checklist covers all things related to child protection online at home. The eighteen page document, contains a wealth of information and ideas on how to reduce potential vulnerabilities once your pupils have left the school premises. There will be a limit of two families per week.

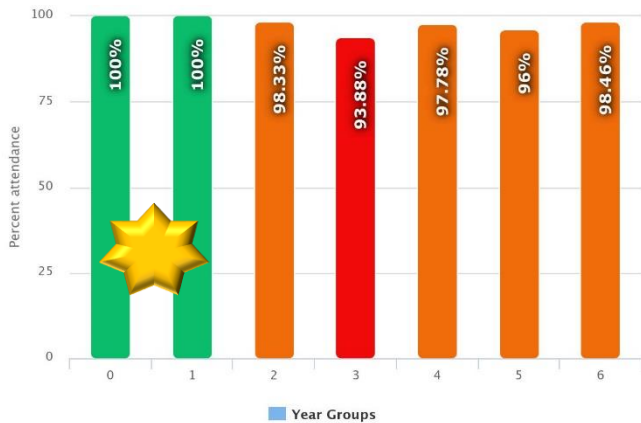
*This is a great opportunity for you to see what is happening in school that week, experience our regular school lunches, and spend some time with the children and adults in school.*
