

I will be starting work on a **Whole School Food Policy** next term, with the intention of implementing from Septemeber. Where possible we do aim to create a Healthy School environment. If anyone would like to help with this in particular, then please do let me know.

The Family Questionnaire that has been issued this week, is a vital part of us moving the school forward in all areas of what we do. Your thoughts, feedback, opinions and suggestions are all very much appreciated. We understand that for some of you, it may feel a little 'akward' to complete – however, we very much do want your opnions, and all responses will be treated confidentially. Please ensure that you complete the questionnaire and bring back to school on your parent consultation meeting. Thank you

Cost Saving – did you know that there are a number of ways to help with your school expenditure? For those of you on a low income, it is definitely worth exploring Free School Meals. Free school meals | North Yorkshire County Council Also - remember all children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are entitled to free school meals under the Universal Infant Free School Meal Scheme.

If you use **Buddies**, then why not sign up for Tax Free Childcare? In the government scheme called tax-free childcare, working families can get up to £500 every three months (£2000 a year) for each of your children, to help with the costs of childcare. **Get Tax-Free Childcare: step by step - GOV.UK (www.gov.uk)**

Next term's clubs are just being finalised – and will be published on Monday, and then set up on Parentpay to sign up to by the end of the week. Clubs will start w/c 24th April 2023.

Finally, I would really like to enhance the school office (following on from the School Councils audit!!) – brighten it up and rearrange. 






This week's attendance
