Hello everybody,

This next half term (I can't believe there are only 6 weeks left!) is one of transition. The children who will be starting with us in Reception in September will be visiting our school and starting to get to know us better. Our Year 6 children will be also be visiting their new secondary schools, making new friends and starting to get to know how things work in what will be a very different setting. I think that it is in this period that our school Pillars of **Family** and **Ready to Fly** really shine through. We do however recognise that this can be an unsettling period for all of the children and one that can cause a whole range of emotions from excitement and happiness to anxiety and worry. We like to take a personalised approach to supporting them – if there is anything further that you think we can do to support your child, please just come and let us know.

It's an incredibly busy half term. Please look out for the dates of sports days, trips, productions and opportunities to come into school. It will be great to see as many of you there as possible. Next week the Year 6 children will be completing their **sponsored walk** to try to raise some money for their exciting trip to Leeds! And don't forget the **Cake Bake Sale** on Thursday & Friday which includes the Bothams Hamper Raffle (drawn on Friday morning)

Next week the Year 4 children will be tackling the **National Multiplication Check**. This is an online test that all Year 4 pupils have to complete. There are twenty multiplication questions and the children have six seconds to type in the correct answer. This speedy recall is something which we are developing as a school and you will often see the children playing multiplication games when lining up and at the start of lessons. This will undoubtedly remain a focus and any practice that the children can do at home is hugely beneficial. We tend to start at 1s and 10s and then progress to 2s and 5s. We then tackle 3s and 4s as these will help the children to learn their 6s and 8s.

In addition to the Multiplication Check, next week the Year 1 children will be completing their **Phonic Screen**. Again, this is a statutory assessment, designed to measure if the children have the expected level of Phonic Knowledge. As with all assessments, we'll make these a positive and stress-free experience.


