Hello everybody,

The transition into Autumn always marks a busy time for school. Next Friday, with Rev. Joe, we will be holding our **Harvest Festival** at All Saints church in Brompton. It would be great to see as many of you there as possible. Each class will perform a small section of the service about Harvest. As in previous years, we will be holding a collection for The Rainbow Centre, Scarborough. Times have been tough for us all, but more so for local charities. Therefore, we would like to ask for donations from parents/carers of food/produce, to help support this cause. If you can support this, please send in your donations with the children on the mornings of the 13th October.

Our boy's **football** team starts their league campaign with matches against Lindhead and East Ayton next week, followed by games against Northstead and Gladstone Road the following week! I'm really looking forward to seeing them enjoy playing as a team and representing the school. Similarly, on Tuesday our **Cross-Country** runners will be taking on the course at Scarborough Rugby club. I know that the school pillars of **Ready to Fly** and **Family** will shine through.

Twenty-eight of our children are currently working with the **Children's University.** This is a national charity which aims to raise children's confidence and attainment by rewarding them for trying new experiences and gaining new skills. Well done to all of the children for doing this outside of school time.

**Forest school** has started again for Classes 1 and 2. Although access to our normal site is still restricted, there are plenty of other areas which the children are using to develop those Forest School skills. We are hoping to again access the 'normal' woodland from January, however rest assured that we are also making other plans and exploring other exciting opportunities! I am keen to extend the opportunities that the children have to learn in the outdoors still further, allowing them to develop those key practical, communication and teamwork skills so important to life, as well as a love of the environment. In the not too distant future we will hopefully be able to also offer *River* and *Beach* school experiences!

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








# This week's attendance
