Hello everybody,

This week has reminded me just how much we do beyond the curriculum to develop our children's **understanding of the world**, far beyond the National Curriculum! We have had a visit from the police to help Class 1 investigate a crime (Cinderella is now behind bars!) considered the greening of Singapore and then Remembrance in assemblies, alongside a pizza-making Phunky Foods session in myHappymind workshop. We've also had a visit from Power Down Pete who spoke to the children about sustainable energy and energy saving, and children in Buddies had a Boccia taster session with Alan, a friend of the school who last week introduced us to his guide dog- Oscar. It's important that we give the children to opportunity to reflect on all of these things through the lens of our school Pillars - these are a constant reference point for everything that we do.

Nature is such an important Pillar for the school and one which the children readily and easily refer to, question and challenge as they consider the world around them. They are developing a really palpable sense of responsibility for the world around them, something which will be so important as they will be the planet's guardians of the future. **Forest School** is an obvious link to this, one which we know the children look forward to immensely. It's been quite a frustrating period of time regarding Forest School. Access to our usual site has been restricted this term and therefore the children have been practicing their Forest School skills in different areas of the village. Despite encouraging signs at times, the situation with the site does not appear likely to change and therefore we have had to reconsider what we do to develop those Forest School skills and a love of nature...

We are actually so much more than a 'Forest' School. We have more than the 'Forest' around us and could draw upon rivers, farming and the beach to further these skills. Our Pillars and ethos are more focused on developing a love of nature and fostering a sense of responsibility then a normal 'Forest' school. It runs deeper. There are wider Forest school skills that we can develop if we use our surroundings differently and we also have many more options locally. We are currently developing exciting plans to bring all of this together, something which we are looking to launch in Spring Term. Our current site would normally be left at this time of year anyway so as not to damage the vegetation and so the children will not be missing out. Plans are currently taking shape, including regular whole-day forest experiences at Wydale Hall, regular opportunities to 'camp', the development of 'River' and 'Beach' School as part of a yearly overview of activities, alongside ensuring that, as a school, we are as sustainable, conscientious and proactive as possible to protect the world around us. We'll share more details soon!

Next week we are interviewing for the role of **School Administrator**. The successful applicant will be joining us before Christmas to work alongside Mrs Hargreaves in order to ensure that the handover is as smooth as possible. I'll update you more next week!


his after-school drop in club is for children and their families if they would like to join us

You are welcome to bring up to two adults and any younger siblings.


There will be a limit of two families per day.


