Can you help Lily, Martha and Rory's Mum? She is taking on quite a challenge!

Four and a half years ago Alex, my husband and father to our four children became ill. What began as a feeling of coldness in his legs was followed by dizziness, loss of vision, weakness which included an inability to walk and numerous other symptoms. After a tense time, multiple tests including a lumbar puncture and scans, he was diagnosed with Acute Disseminated Encephalomyelitis (ADEM), a rare condition, normally affecting children it causes inflammation of the brain and spinal cord as the immune system attacks the body in error.

Although Alex has some residual side effects from the damage the inflammation caused he has made an amazing recovery including learning to walk again.

There are many forms of Encephalitis which affects both young and old alike however, it is an illness that is unknown to many.

This year I have decided to raise money for The Encephalitis Society, a society which provides support, awareness and research about Encephalitis as this is a cause that is indeed close to my heart.

So far we have had a Cuppa & Cake event but my biggest challenge is yet to come.....Loch Ness Marathon on the 24th September, 26.2 undulating miles of putting one foot in front of the other and maybe, if I'm lucky I'll get to see Nessy!
