Dear Families and Friends,

Thank you, once again, for all your support over the school closure and for continuing the learning at home! We now have two weeks of rest in the form of our original Easter Holiday. However, to keep up routine, you may still want to keep sending in your home learning, but be mindful that teacher responses may not be as prompt as in term time.

It is not known yet whether the school closure will end. I will look to keep you informed as soon as information arrives – this is, generally, when it is announced by the government on TV. (We don't get any 'insider' information, I'm afraid!)

The school is now closed for Easter. However, if key worker parents/carers have no other safe childcare, including being looked after by a 'non-key worker parent/carer', then the school can open at short notice by contacting Mr Cooper: headteacher@bromptonsawdon.n-yorks.sch.uk or on the school mobile: 07561 826989.

At this present moment, we are expecting to only open after Easter for key worker and vulnerable students, but only when there is no other childcare option available or where it is in the best interests of the children to be in school. This also includes the option of one parent/carer working from home (if feasible), even if they are a key worker. If this situation changes, again, I will look to update you.

As it comes to the end of the financial year, please can you settle your Parent Pay account. Thank you to all the parents/carers that have done this already, even in these times of unknowing. It really helps us.

Peat Rigg

We are awaiting further information regarding the Peat Rigg residential visit, which is due to take place at the end of May. Should we have to postpone, we will look at all other options of rearrangement, so that all students, including the Year 6s, can have the opportunity of attending, even if this means coming back to join us next year during a half-term break (for example!)

Should the trip be cancelled or rearranged to an unsuitable date, a full refund will be given. Any decision on this trip will be taken much further in the future, to ensure we give it every chance.

Thank you all for your flexibility and support over a challenging term. I hope you have enjoyed all the photos and videos uploaded to Class Dojo over the last fortnight. Should this closure become prolonged, we will look to continue this learning approach by replenishing home learning packs and ensuring that we can provide the same sense of normality to the most important people in all our lives: the children.
